DID YOU KNOW THAT, IN FLORIDA...

ESTATE PLANNING refers to the set of documents that protects you during your lifetime and after death. It often consists of a LAST WILL & TESTAMENT, HEALTH CARE SURROGATE, DURABLE POWER OF ATTORNEY and LIVING WILL. It might also include a LIVING REVOCABLE TRUST or DEED(S).

If **DIVORCING** spouses can't agree on how to distribute their marital residence, the Court may be asked to **PARTITION** the residence and, in such case, may direct that it be sold to a buyer for the current market value and the net sales proceeds are equally divided.

GUARDIANSHIP Court appoints a surrogate decision-maker for personal and/or financial decisions for a minor or an adult with mental or physical disabilities (the **WARD**). Some of the more common reasons for a Ward needing a Guardianship are to receive proceeds from a lawsuit, insurance policy or inheritance. An adult Guardianship may be necessary if the Court finds an individual's ability to make decisions so impaired that a Guardian is needed to make decisions on his/her behalf. Guardianship is a last resort, especially where naming someone as **ATTORNEY-IN-FACT** under a *Durable Power of Attorney, Health Care Surrogate* or *Trustee* could be a lesser restrictive alternative.

HOMESTEAD laws are amongst the most liberal of any state. In many cases, Florida allows homeowners to shield the total value of their home from creditors even in the event of **BANKRUPTCY**. Also, only a very short list of creditors (including the IRS, Mortgage holders, general contractors and other materialmen, and Homeowner's/Condominium Associations) can force the sale of a home to collect on payments in arrears.
